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Other forms of knowledge

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"in carrying out its work the Platform will be guided by the following operating principles: Recognize and respect the contribution of indigenous and local knowledge to the conservation and sustainable use of biodiversity and ecosystems" (UNEP/IPBES.MI2/9 Appendix 1, para 2d).

bn Other forms of knowledge MEP has to "explor[e] ways and means to bring different knowledge systems, including indigenous knowledge systems, into the science-policy interface" (UNEP/IPBES.MI2/9 Appendix 1, para 15) g)

Platform has to "*develop an understanding* of how to effectively integrate local and traditional knowledge" (UNEP/IPBES.MI2/9 para 20)

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MEP was requested "to recommend possible procedures and approaches for working with different knowledge systems for consideration by the Plenary at its second session, drawing on the inputs received" (IPBES/1/12, Annex III, para 11)

Work Programme 2014-2018 Deliverables

Objective 1:

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Strengthen the capacity and **knowledge foundations** of the sciencepolicy interface to implement key functions of the Platform

- 1 a: Priority capacity-building-needs to implement the Platform's work programme matched with resources through catalysing financial and in-kind support
- 1 b: Capacities needed to implement the Platform's work programme developed
- 1 c: Procedures, approaches and participatory processes for working with indigenous and local knowledge systems
- 1 d: Priority knowledge and data needs for policymaking addressed through catalysing efforts to generate new knowledge and networking



Steps taken

- Specific MEP members responsible for deliverable 1c
- •Task force established at IPBES 2 (2013)
- Nomination of ILK holders and experts on ILK encouraged for scoping and assessment teams
- Roster of experts opened (for ILK holders AND experts on ILK)
- Dialogue workshops (e.g. during pollination assessment)
- Task force proposes an "Approach for recognizing and working with indigenous and local knowledge" at IPBES 5 (March 2017)
- IPBES 5 approves this approach (see IPBES 5/L6)





- ILK holders and experts on ILK in all teams (see Rules of Procedures)
- Understanding of key terms (ILK, ILK holders, experts....)
- Best practices for dialogue workshops
- Phase 1: collaborative definition of problems and goals, is to be realized during the scoping of an assessment
- Phase 2: synthesizing, and incorporating into the assessment, a wide array of evidence and data from multiple sources of ILK related to the assessment
- Phase 3: appropriately engaging indigenous peoples and local communities in the review of the various drafts of a specific assessment
- Phase 4: sharing knowledge and insights gained through an assessment with indigenous peoples and local communities once the assessment is concluded



Participatory Mechanism

Central component: web-based platform

Elements:

- web-based consultations and dialogue workshops
- discussion forums for shared learning and exchange
- capacity building through strategic partnerships
- registry of individuals, social organizations, institutions and networks
- roster
- repository of relevant resources of indigenous and local knowledge
- A display of ongoing activities pertaining to ILK
- A place to self-organize for registered individuals or entities
